1 CORPORATE INFORMATION

The Company is a private limited liability company, incorporated and domiciled in Malaysia.

The principal activities of the Company are that of fabrication and refurbishment of heavy machinery parts.

There has been no significant change in the nature of these activities during the financial year.

The registered office of the Company is A1-3 Jalan 2/142A, Megan Phoenix Cheras KM 10, 56000 Kuala Lumpur.

The principal place of business of the Company is 9 Jalan Apollo U5/194, Bandar Pinggiran Subang, 40150 Shah Alam Selangor.

The number of employees of the Company (including salaried directors) at the end of the financial year was 10.

The financial statements were authorised for issue by the Board of Directors in accordance with a resolution of the directors on 17 April 2015.

2 SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

(a) Basis of preparation

The financial statements are prepared on the going concern basis under the historical cost convention, and comply with the provisions of the Companies Act, 1965, and the applicable Malaysian Private Entities Reporting Standards in Malaysia.

The financial statements are presented in Ringgit Malaysia (RM).

(b) Property, plant and equipment and depreciation

Property, plant and equipment, are stated at cost or valuation less accumulated depreciation and impairment losses, if any.

Depreciation is provided on the straight line basis, calculated to write off the cost of each asset to its residual value over its estimated useful life, at the following annual rates:

(b) Property, plant and equipment and depreciation

Residual values, useful lives and depreciation methods are reviewed at balance sheet date to ensure that they are consistent with previous estimates and the expected pattern of consumption of future economic benefits embodied in the items of property, plant and equipment.

Property, plant and equipment are no longer recognised when no future economic benefits are expected from their use, or upon disposal.

Gains or losses on disposals are determined by comparing proceeds with carrying amounts and are included in the income statement.

(c) Impairment of non-financial assets

The carrying values of assets, other than current assets, are reviewed at the balance sheet date to ascertain whether there are any indications of impairment. If any such impairment exists, the asset's recoverable value is estimated to determine the amount of impairment loss.

The recoverable value of an asset is the higher of its net selling price and value in use, which is measured by reference to discounted future cash flows. An impairment loss occurs when the carrying amount of an asset exceeds its recoverable value.

An impairment loss is recognised in the income statement in the period in which it arises, unless the asset is carried at a revalued amount, in which case the impairment loss is accounted for as a revaluation decrease to the extent that the impairment loss does not exceed the amount held in the fair value reserve for the same asset.

A reversal of impairment losses recognised in previous years is effected when the impairment losses for the assets have decreased or no longer exist.

(d) Provisions

Provisions for liabilities are recognised when past events result in present obligations for settlement and it is probable that an outflow of resources embodying economic benefits will be required to settle the obligations, and where reliable estimates of the amounts can be made.

Where the amounts of such liabilities cannot be determined, best estimates are made based on available information. In determining best estimates, the effect of the time value of money is taken into consideration where material, and the value of the provision is discounted using a pretax discount rate that reflects, where appropriate, the risks specific to the liability. When this method is used, the increase in the provision due to the passage of time is recognised as a finance cost.

Provisions are reviewed at the balance sheet date and adjusted to reflect current best estimates.

2 SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

(e) Revenue

Revenue is recognised when it is probable that the economic benefits associated with the transaction will flow to the Company and the value of which can be reliably measured.

Revenue represents value of goods sold and services rendered less returns and discounts allowed, net of sales and service taxes where applicable.

Revenue from sale of goods is recognised when significant risks and rewards of ownership of the goods have passed to the buyer, while revenue from services rendered is recognised upon its completion.

(f) Employee benefits

(i) Short term benefits

Salaries, wages, bonuses and social security contributions are recognised as an expense in the year in which the associated services are rendered by employees of the Company.

Employees are also entitled to paid annual leave earned on a cumulative basis. Short term non-cumulative leave, such as sick leave, are recognised when such leave are taken.

(ii) Defined contribution plans

Defined contribution plans are post-employment benefit plans under which a participating company pays fixed contributions into separate entities or funds and thereafter has no legal or constructive obligation to pay further contributions should these funds not contain sufficient resources to pay employee benefits relating to employee services in the current and/or preceding financial years.

As required by law, the Company makes such contributions to the Employees' Provident Fund (EPF) and recognise such contributions as an expense in the income statement on an incurred basis.

(g) Inventories

Inventories are stated at the lower of cost and net realisable value, and are principally determined on the first-in first-out basis. Net realisable value represents the estimated selling price less all estimated costs to completion and costs to be incurred in marketing, selling and distribution.

For work-in-progress and finished goods, cost consists of raw materials, direct labour, and an appropriate proportion of fixed and variable production overheads.

2 SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

(h) Taxation

Taxation comprises current year provision on taxable income for the year using tax rates enacted, or substantively enacted, at balance sheet date, adjustments to tax payable in respect of previous years, if any, as well as deferred taxation.

Taxation deferred by temporary differences arising between the tax base of assets and their carrying values in the financial statements are accounted for using the liability method, except where the tax effect of such differences are expected to be deferred indefinitely, or where the effect of such differences are not material.

The tax effect of temporary differences which result in a debit balance is not recognised in the financial statements unless there is a reasonable expectation of realisation.

(i) Financial instruments

Financial instruments are recognised in the balance sheet when the Company has become a party to the contractual provisions of the instrument and are classified either as equity, assets or liabilities, in accordance with the substance of the contractual arrangement.

Interest, dividends, gains or losses relating to financial instruments classified as assets or liabilities, are reported as income or expenses. Distributions to holders of financial instruments classified as equity, are recognised directly in equity.

Financial instruments are offset only when the Company has a legally enforceable right to do so and intends to settle, either on a net basis, or to realise the asset and settle the liability simultaneously.

(i) Cash and cash equivalents

Cash and cash equivalents consist of cash in hand, bank balances, demand deposits, and short term highly liquid investments which are readily convertible to known amounts of cash and have an insignificant risk of changes in value, against which bank overdrafts, if any, are deducted.

(ii) Receivables

Receivables are stated at cost less allowances for doubtful debts while bad debts are written off in the financial year in which they are identified.

(iii) Payables

Payables are stated at cost, being the fair value of the consideration paid for goods and services received.

2 SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

(i) Financial instruments

(iv) Interest bearing borrowings

Interest bearing bank loans and overdrafts are stated at the amount of proceeds received.

Borrowing costs directly attributable to the acquisition or construction of assets which necessarily take a substantial period of time to get ready for their intended use, are capitalised as part of the cost of these assets.

All other borrowing costs are recognised as an expense in the income statement in the period in which they are incurred.

(j) Hire purchase arrangements

Assets acquired under hire purchase arrangements are capitalised in the financial statements and the corresponding obligations treated as liabilities in the balance sheet.

Hire purchase payments are apportioned between the finance costs and the reduction of the outstanding liabilities.

Finance costs, which represent the difference between the total hire purchase commitments and the fair value of the assets acquired, net of deposits paid, are recognised in the income statement over the period of the hire purchase agreements so as to produce a constant periodic rate charge on the remaining balance of the obligations for each accounting period.

(k) Foreign currencies

The currency of the primary economic environment in which the Company operates is known as the functional currency.

The Company operates in Malaysia and uses the currency of Malaysia as the functional currency for the presentation of its financial statements.

Transactions in foreign currencies during the financial year are recorded in the functional currency using exchange rates prevailing at the transaction dates. At the balance sheet date, monetary items denominated in foreign currencies are translated at rates of exchange prevailing on that date. Non-monetary items carried at fair value denominated in foreign currencies, are translated at rates of exchange prevailing on the date the fair value was determined. Non-monetary items carried at historical cost in a foreign currency are translated using exchange rates at the date of the transactions.

Exchange differences arising on the settlement of monetary items, and on the translation of monetary and non-monetary items, are included in the income statement for the financial period.

3 FINANCIAL INSTRUMENTS

(a) Fair value

The carrying amounts of financial assets and liabilities at balance sheet date approximate their fair values.

(b) Financial risk management policies

The Company's financial risk management policies seek to ensure that adequate financial resources are available for the development of the Company's business whilst at the same time, managing its risks.

(c) Credit risk

The Company has a credit policy in place and the exposure to credit risk is monitored on an ongoing basis. Credit evaluations are performed on all customers requiring credit over a certain amount. The Company does not require collateral in respect of credit extensions to customers.

Credit terms for trade receivables are assessed and approved on a case by case basis and are granted for a period ranging from 30 days to 60 days. The Company does not have any significant concentration of credit risk that may arise from exposure to a single debtor or to groups of debtors.

Credit terms for trade payables range from 30 days to 60 days.

(d) Liquidity risk

The Company monitors and maintains a level of cash and cash equivalents deemed adequate to finance its business activities and to mitigate the effects of fluctuations in cash flows.

3 FINANCIAL INSTRUMENTS

(e) Interest rate risk

The Company's exposure to changes in interest rates relates primarily to financial borrowings and/or short term deposits placed with licensed financial institutions.

There is no formal hedging policy with respect to interest rate fluctuations.

Exposure to interest rate risk is monitored on an ongoing basis, and the Company endeavours to keep the exposure at an acceptable level.

(f) Currency risk

The Company incurs foreign currency risks on purchases of goods that are denominated in currencies other than its functional currency. The currencies giving rise to this risk are reflected in the accounting policies.

The Company does not hedge its foreign currency exposure by purchasing forward currency contracts.

Exposure to currency risk is monitored on an ongoing basis, and the Company endeavours to keep the exposure at an acceptable level.
