DIRECTORS' REPORT

Dear Members,

Your Directors have pleasure in presenting the **Fifth Annual Report** of the Company and the Audited Statement of Accounts for the financial year ended 31st March, 2017.

1. FINANCIAL HIGHLIGHTS

The highlights of the performance of the Company for the financial ended 31st March, 2017 is summarised below:

2. DIVIDEND

The Board of Directors has not recommended any dividend as the Company has not made any profits in FY 2016-17.

3. OPERATIONS

The business plan for growth in turnover for the year did not materialise primarily due to the big shortfall in COE Partner projects (against projections of Rs. 122.00 lakhs we could bill only Rs. 41.00 lakhs; Last year Rs. 79.00 lakhs was billed). Most of the institutes abandoned their plans for setting up COE centres (CV Raman Institute, Ahmednagar Auto & Engg Association, Cummins ITI, etc). In the segment of Skilling & education the achievement was only Rs. 60.00 lakhs against the plan of Rs. 88.00 lakhs (Last year Rs. 68.00 lakhs). Generally, the flow of enquires was tardy due to training budget cuts; the expected contracts with majors like BARTI and M&M did not materialise due to their decision to discontinue with further batches in Pune. We lost a few orders based on lower prices offered by competitors. However, the redeeming feature is that some of the corporate (e.g. GE) have reverted to us and discussing

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training of their next batches with us, as they are dissatisfied with the quality of training they experienced with the other party. Most of our skill training revenues were accounted for by new business. We believe that the awareness about our institute is spreading & should enhance our customer base for future.

For the year FY 2017-18, we hope to receive larger number of enquiries from corporate. With the addition of the Resistance welding module we hope to receive good response from the Auto sector in Pimpri / Chinchwad / Chakan cluster as well as the ITI students. We are also in discussions with some skilling institutes of a variety of technical skills, to organise programs at our premises; the partnership models are under discussion. We will continue to work on cost control; variable costs have been optimised to achieve better levels of operational economics, resulting in the bottom-line for the Q4 to be the best in any quarter so far! For sustainability, we need to explore working models that will reduce fixed costs. The focus, of course, will remain on building capability & capacity to increase revenues from existing business segments as well as creating new ones.

In FY 2016-17, the Company repaid / settled all the said loans & advances availed / taken from its Holding Company. Further, the Company has also taken credit facilities of Rs. 100.00 Lakhs from M/s. HDFC Bank Ltd. to meet the working capital requirements of the Company, which are guaranteed by M/s. Ador Welding Ltd.

All Related Party Transactions were executed in the ordinary course of business and negotiated on arms length basis with pricing compatible to market quotes and transactions of similar nature with other parties. Details of transactions with related parties are depicted as part of notes to accounts.

None of the transactions with any of the Related Parties was in conflict with the interest of the Company.

9. FOREIGN EXCHANGE

There was no Foreign Exchange Earnings and outgo during the financial year under review.

10. FIXED DEPOSITS

The Company has not accepted any deposits from its Directors and / or their relatives during the year under review.

11. INSURANCE

The properties / assets of the Company are adequately insured.

12. ENERGY CONSERVATION, TECHNOLOGY ABSORPTION & FOREIGN EXCHANGE

As per Section 134 of the Companies Act, 2013 read with the Rules framed thereunder, requirements of disclosure with regard to the conservation of energy are not applicable to the Company.

The Company gives consultancy & training in welding field and does not have any conventional manufacturing activities. Hence, details of conservation of energy are not required to be furnished. However, the Company is taking sufficient steps for the purpose of energy conservation and ensuring safety.

The Company has not incurred any expenses on Research & Development during the year under review.

13. DIRECTORS

1. Mr. Raman Kumar, Chairman of the Company, tendered his resignation effective from 10th May, 2017 from the Directorship of the Company in the Board Meeting held on 10th April, 2017.

The Board took note of the same and expressed its gratitude towards Mr. Raman Kumar for the valuable services rendered by him during his tenure. The Board also appreciated his contributions towards the progress of the Company from its inception. The Board also applauded his support, vision, guidance and leadership skills which benefited the Company to grow in a sustainable manner.

All necessary resolutions were passed at the said Board Meeting and relevant Forms pertaining to resignation of Mr. Raman Kumar are being filed with MCA (ROC) within stipulated time to effect his resignation.

2. Mr. Satish M. Bhat (DIN: 05168265) joined the Board of Directors as an "Additional Director" with effect from 09th May, 2017. The Company has received Notice in writing from a Member proposing his candidature to the Office of Director of the Company. In the interest of the Company's continued prosperity and well-being, the Board recommends his appointment as the Director (Chairman) at the forthcoming 5th Annual General Meeting.

The Board of Directors, pursuant to section 151 of the Companies Act, 2013 & Rule 8 of the Companies (Appointment & Qualification of Directors) Rules, 2014, has received Form MBP-1 and Consent to act as a Director in Form DIR-2, from Mr. Satish M. Bhat.

Most of the employees are on contractual basis whereas a few are deputed from its Holding Company, Ador Welding Ltd (AWL) whose salary and related costs are reimbursed to AWL.

INDEPENDENT AUDITOR'S REPORT TO THE MEMBERS OF ADOR WELDING ACADEMY PRIVATE LIMITED

REPORT ON THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

1.We have audited the accompanying financial statements of ADOR WELDING ACADEMY PRIVATE LIMITED("The Company") which comprise the Balance Sheet as at 31st March, 2017 and the Statement of Profit and Loss and the cash flow statement for the year then ended and a summary of the significant accounting policies and other explanatory information.

Management's Responsibility for the Financial Statements

2. The Company's Management is responsible for the matters stated in Section 134(5) of the Companies Act, 2013 ("The Act") with respect to the preparation of these financial statements, that give a true and fair view of the financial position, financial performance and cash flows of the Company in accordance with the accounting principles generally accepted in India, including the Accounting Standards specified under Section 133 of the Act, read with Rule 7 of the Companies (Accounts) Rules, 2014 (as amended). This responsibility also includes maintenance of adequate accounting records in accordance with the provisions of the Act for safeguarding the assets of the Company and for preventing and detecting frauds and other irregularities; selection and application of appropriate accounting policies; making judgments and estimates that are reasonable and prudent; and design, implementation and maintenance of adequate internal financial controls, that were operating effectively for ensuring the accuracy and completeness of the accounting records, relevant to the preparation and presentation of the financial statements that give a true and fair view and are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error.

Auditor's Responsibility

- 3. Our responsibility is to express an opinion on these financial statements based on our audit. We have taken into account the provisions of the Act, the accounting and auditing standards and matters which are required to be included in the audit report under the provisions of the Act and the Rules made there under. We conducted our audit in accordance with the Standards on Auditing issued by the Institute of Chartered Accountants of Indiaunder section 143(10) of the Act. Those Standards require that we comply with ethical requirements and plan and perform the audit to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the financial statements are free from material misstatement.

Statement of Significant Accounting Policies and Practices:-

Basis of preparation of financial statements :

These financial statements have been prepared in accordance with the generally accepted accounting principles in India under the historical cost convention on accrual basis. Pursuant to Section 133 of the Companies Act, 2013 read with Rule 7 of the Companies (Accounts) Rules, 2014, till the standards of accounting or any addendum thereto are prescribed by the Central Government in consultation and recommendation of the National Financial Reporting Authority, the existing Accounting Standards notified under the Companies Act, 1956 shall continue to apply. Consequently, these financial statements have been prepared to comply in all material aspects with the accounting standards notified under Section 211(3C) [Companies (Accounting Standards) Rules, 2006, as amended] and other relevant provisions of the Companies Act, 2013.

All the assets and liabilities have been classified as current or non-current as per the Company's operating cycle and other criteria set out in the Schedule III to the Companies Act, 2013. Based on the nature of products and the time between the acquisition of assets for processing and their realisation in cash and cash equivalents, the Company has ascertained its operating cycle as 12 months for the purpose of current, non-current classification of assets and liabilities.

II) Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in confirmity with generally accepted accounting principles requires estimates and assumptions to be made that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities on the date of the financial statements and the reported amounts of revenues and expenses during the reporting period. Differences between actual results and estimates are recognised in the period in which the results are known.

- III) Recognition of Income and Expenditure
- 1. Sale of goods is recognized on transfer of significant risks and rewards of ownership which is generally on the dispatch of goods by the Company.
- 2. Other Revenue / Income and Cost / Expenditure are generally accounted on accrual as they are earned or incurred.



IV) Fixed Assets

- 1. Fixed Assets are accounted by the Company on the basis of historical costs. Gains or Losses arising on disposal are recognised in the statement of Profit and Loss Account of the relevant financial year.
- 2. Method of Depreciation / Amortisation:
- a) During the quarter ended 30th September, 2014, the Company has revised its policy of providing depreciation on fixed assets effective 1st April, 2014. The depreciation is now provided on Straight Line Method (SLM) based on useful life given in the Schedule II to the Companies Act, 2013.
- b) Depreciation on additions / deletions is charged on pro-rata basis, upto the month of purchase / including the month of sale.

V) Taxation

Income tax expense comprises Current Tax and Deferred Tax charge or credit. Provision for current tax is made on the basis of the assessable income at the tax rate applicable to the relevant assessment year. The deferred tax asset and deferred tax liability is calculated by applying tax rate and laws that have been enacted or substantively enacted by the Balance Sheet date. Deferred tax assets arising mainly on account of brought forward losses and unabsorbed depreciation under tax laws, are recognized, only if there is a virtual certainty of its realization, supported by convincing evidence. Deferred tax assets on account of other timing differences are recognized only to the extent there is a reasonable certainty of its realization. At each Balance Sheet date, the carrying amount of deferred tax assets are reviewed to reassure realization.

VI) Consumables and stores spares

Consumables, stores and spares are charged off to profit and loss account.

VII) Employee Benefits:-

Employee benefits such as Providend Fund, ESI, Gratuity are not extended to the employees as the provisions of the respective Acts are not applicable to the Company as on balance sheet date.
